Whether you are a home owner, a landlord or a construction professional, if you're looking for guidance on building conservation best practice then Historic Environment Scotland offers a wide range of helpful documents catered to different levels and requirements. In the left hand column of this page you can download a copy of Advisory Standards of Conservation and Repair for the Historic Buildings Environment of Scotland which is intended to assist in the execution of works to historic and traditional buildings in Scotland. The short guides include topics such as sash and case windows; guttering; slate roofs; masonry and mortars; insulation and damp. The INFORM guides are a highly accessible series of entry level publications full of helpful information. The Short Guides series provide more in-depth guidance and the Technical Advice Notes are even more detailed and orientated towards professionals. Expert building advice articles on building components, building materials, and common problems are available on the Historic Environment Scotland 'Engine Shed' website.
