


















The Picts-Perthshire was part of South Pictland

GRAVEYARD ACTIVITIES 1:

MAKING YOUR OWN WALL PLAQUE

- Step 1. Look at the gravestones in your churchyard
- Step 2.Make some sketches of any symbols you like-are there any ships, angels, hammers, ploughs?
- Step 3. What symbols do you want to tell your history? Dog, bike, flowers, tractor, football, birds, book-something you like
- Step 4. Take a ball of sourdough and separate into tow, one a bit bigger than the other.
- Step 5. Roll the larger section out into a nice circle
- With the other part of dough roll out thin sausages and other shapes into your own symbols, which can be stuck on with a wee bit of water, brushed on with a paint brush
- Step 6. You can make a border if you like, plain, zig-zag or wavy
- Step 7. With glue sticks and cocktail sticks you can decorate it and add your initials
