


The Picts-Perthshire was part of South Pictland










Map of Medieval Parishes in East Perthshire













GRAVEYARD ACTIVITIES 2:

How old is your churchyard and church?

- Look at old maps, dates on the church and gravestones
 - Find the oldest gravestone
- Do you have any small buildings old churches, mausoleums or other small buildings
 - Look at old maps, dates on the church and gravestones

Are there any interesting or famous people or events recorded on the stones? Look at old maps, dates on the church and gravestone inscriptions

Is there any evidence of body snatching in your churchyard?

Look for a watch house or a mort house, cist or chest tombs, burial enclosures



GRAVEYARD ACTIVITIES 3:

Have you spotted any interesting angels

- Look for winged souls
- Do they all look the same or are they different?

Have you spotted any interesting trade symbols? Look for plough, looms, shuttles, hammers, carts

Are there any symbols you do not recognise?

Try and find out what everything is

Have you spotted any death symbols? Look for skulls, crossed bones, hourglasses, sickles

Try sketching out some of the most interesting carvings



GREEN GRAVEYARD ACTIVITIES 4:

How many different plants grow in the churchyard (apart from grass)?

- Ground plants, E.g.Daisies, Dockens, Flowering plants
 - Shrubs and hedges?
 - Trees?

Are there walls and avestones covered in lichens and mosses?

- What about birds and small mammals? *Are there any nests, birds droppings, rabbit droppings, burrows, mole hills?*
 - Try and count how many birds you can see over 1 week
 - Amphibians and reptiles
 - Do you have any frogs, toads or lizards in your churchyard?
