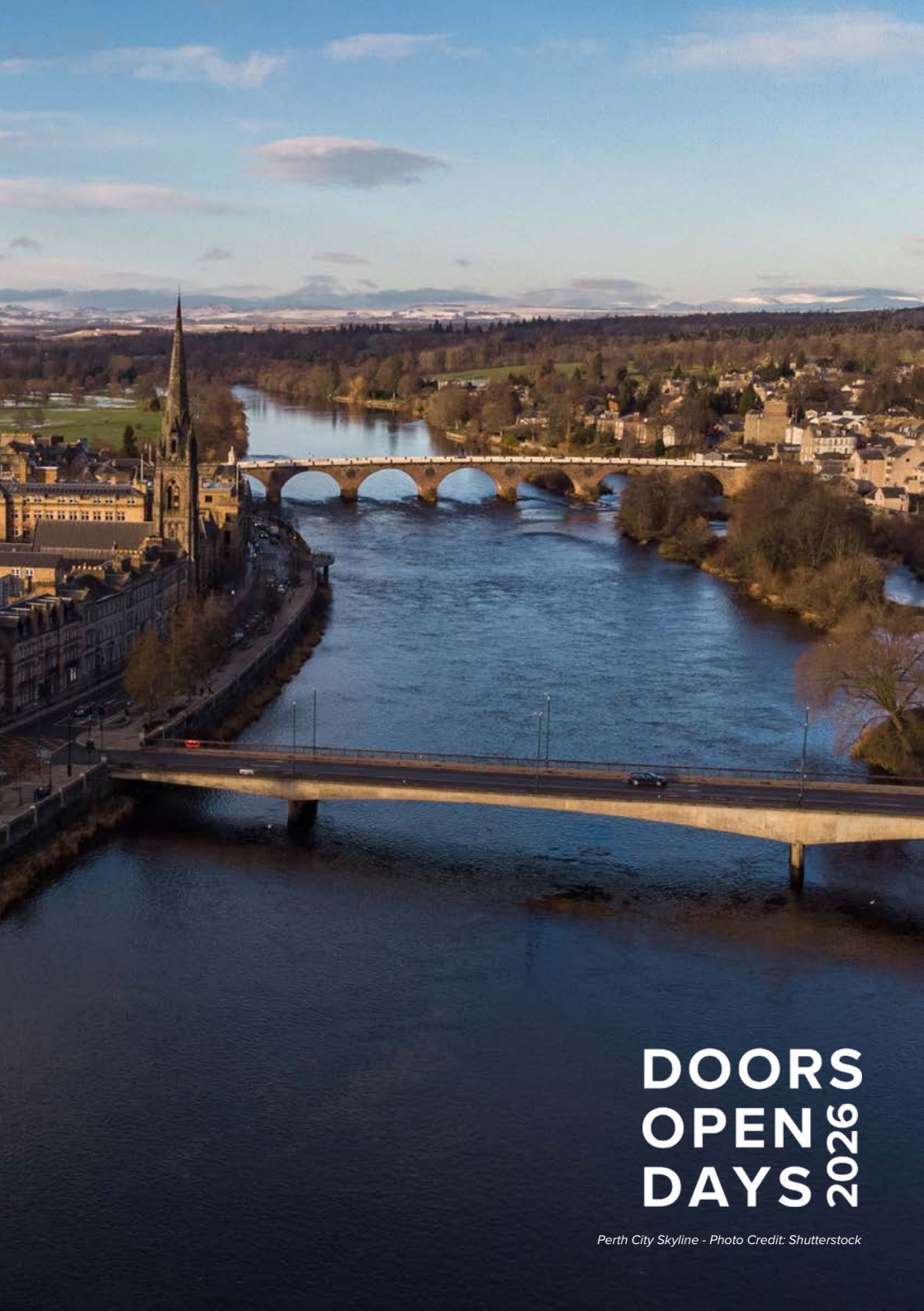
Scottish Archaeology Month (SAM), co-ordinated by Archaeology Scotland, has existed for more than 20 years. Alongside Doors Open Days it constitutes Scotland's contribution to European Heritage Days and helps deliver Aim 4 of Scotland's Archaeology Strategy.

SAM encourages people to interact with their archaeology, history and heritage by co-ordinating and promoting a varied programme of events all across Scotland. These include guided walks, exhibitions, excavations, lectures, performances, re-enactments, traditional skills workshops, storytelling, guided tours, conferences and many other activities.

SAM takes place every year in September but includes events running from the end of August until mid-October.

5 Atholl Crescent, Perth is the central property of a crescent of houses built in the 1790s. The architect of Atholl Crescent is traditionally held to have been Sir Robert Reid. The building served as a family residence until 1923 before being a Nurses' Club and - between 1933 and 2025 - a masonic lodge. After over a hundred years, the building is being restored to a house.

Visitors will see the ground floor of the 1790s building, and the 1932 former masonic hall. Murals, conceived and executed by Thomas Hutchison Peddie - a Perth-born artist and illustrator – will be on display in the hall.



There will be a temporary exhibition to commemorate the 900th anniversary of St John's Kirk of Perth.

#2 Aberdalgie and Dupplin Church

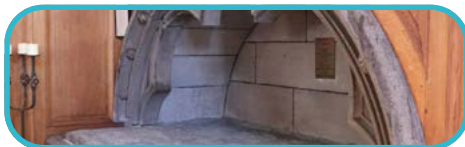


Aberdalgie represents one of the finest examples of an Ecclesiastical Church Cluster in Scotland, consisting of a beautiful church, WW1 war memorial and Oliphant Crypt whose history dates back to the First Wars of Independence and King Robert the Bruce.

Visitors to Aberdalgie can expect a historian-led site tour with references to medieval wars, landowners, local estates, church building construction.

Visitors can also enjoy the newly restored Georgian Walled Garden with children's play area and picnic benches. Refreshments and Souvenirs will be available.

#3 AK Bell Library



AK Bell Library is the main public library for Perth and Kinross. A grade A listed building, it was designed by Perth City Architect, William Macdonald Mackenzie and operated as an Infirmary from 1836 until 1914 when it became a hospital for WW1 soldiers. Later on, it became a tuberculosis centre and offices for Perth Education Authority before reopening in 1994 as AK Bell Library.

Today it is a vibrant community hub where people of all ages can learn, create and connect. From its welcoming children's library and community resources, including the Maker_Space and Perthshire Seed Library, to the city archive and local history collections, there is so much more to discover than just books!



Join us for a behind-the-scenes tour of the library building and a chance to see some of the treasures of our archive and local history collections, led by our expert library and archive staff.

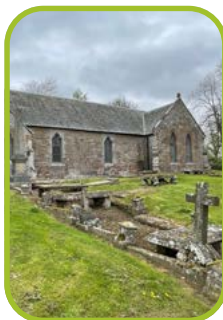

#4 Bendochy Parish Church



One of the oldest ecclesiastical buildings in Scotland. There was a religious centre here in the time of the Culdees. The walls are seven hundred years old. The inside contains 17th cent gravestones. There is a green man gravestone in the graveyard, unique in Scotland. The impressive gate is a war memorial. The church is still currently used weekly for worship.

Members of the church will be available to guide visitors to the interesting and historical features in the building.

#5 Castle Menzies

Castle Menzies is a spectacular sixteenth century Scottish castle, restored during the twentieth century by the Menzies Clan society. Architecturally fascinating, it is a splendid Renaissance example of the transition in Scottish castles from earlier rugged Highland fortresses to later mansion houses.

#7 Creative Rock Art Workshop



A free drop-in, hands-on creative workshop to engage people of all ages with re-imagining the rich prehistoric rock art tradition and archaeology of the area.

Get involved in various fun mark-making and creative activities, inspired by prehistoric rock art and natural pigments, to produce group and individual 'artworks' that bring rock art alive within a contemporary context.

#8 Cultybraggan Camp



Cultybraggan Camp (Camp 21) is the last remaining Prisoner of War Camp from the Second World War in Scotland. We have 90 Nissen Huts from the period and our museum is housed in the A listed brick build jailblock.

Cultybraggan was used by the British army as a training camp until the early 2000s and is now owned by the Community of Comrie as a very unique community hub.

#9 Gleneagles House



Gleneagles, home of the Haldanes since the XII century.

Guided tour of Gleneagles, home to the Haldanes and adjoining family chapel, as well as opening of the garden and opportunity to roam the Gleneagles stretch of the ancient drovers road.

#11 Monzie Kirk



Monzie Kirk was built in 1830-31 to William Stirling's architectural designs. It features artefacts from an earlier mediaeval building - the mediaeval parish has existed since the 13th century.

The churchyard is lined by four ancient yew trees which predate the current building.

Church members will be available to answer questions and information sessions are planned. refreshments will be available.

#12 Museum of Abernethy



The Museum of Abernethy is an independent, volunteer run museum at the heart of Abernethy. Housed in an 18th century building, a former stable and cattle rede, which was converted for use in the 1990s. It houses a collection of local artefacts which tell the story of the area from prehistory through to the modern day.

Volunteers from the Museum of Abernethy will lead tours round the historic centre of the village illustrated with pictures from the past.

#13 The Glovers Hall

The Glover Incorporation of Perth has a history in Perth dating back to the Royal Charter of 1210. Established as a trade/guild to secure the rights of glove makers in Perth, the Incorporation has a rich history as can now be exhibited in the new Perth Museum.

The Glovers' Hall is used for meetings of the Incorporation twice yearly, and is on the first floor of the property.

#14 Perthshire Society of Natural Science



The library of one of the oldest scientific societies in Scotland is off the foyer of Perth Art Gallery. Here you will find our collection of scientific works gathered since 1867. Archaeology, history, botany, geology, ornithology and photography are all represented.

PSNS members will help show artifacts and books relating to Perthshire buildings, landscapes and wildlife at risk. Slideshows of modern and historic images relating to these topics will run throughout the day. The Perth Charterhouse Project team, with collaborators from Perth & Kinross Archive, will also be providing a mini exhibition of original documents relating to the project and providing information on project activities, including upcoming archaeological excavations.

#15 PKAVS - The Walled Garden

A traditional letterpress printing workshop using hand-set metal and wood letters for printing as done from 15th to 20th century. The converted 19th C cottage & wagon shed houses a range of equipment including typesetting machines, hand and power presses. It still operates to produce posters and other items and is used by artists to learn about the process.

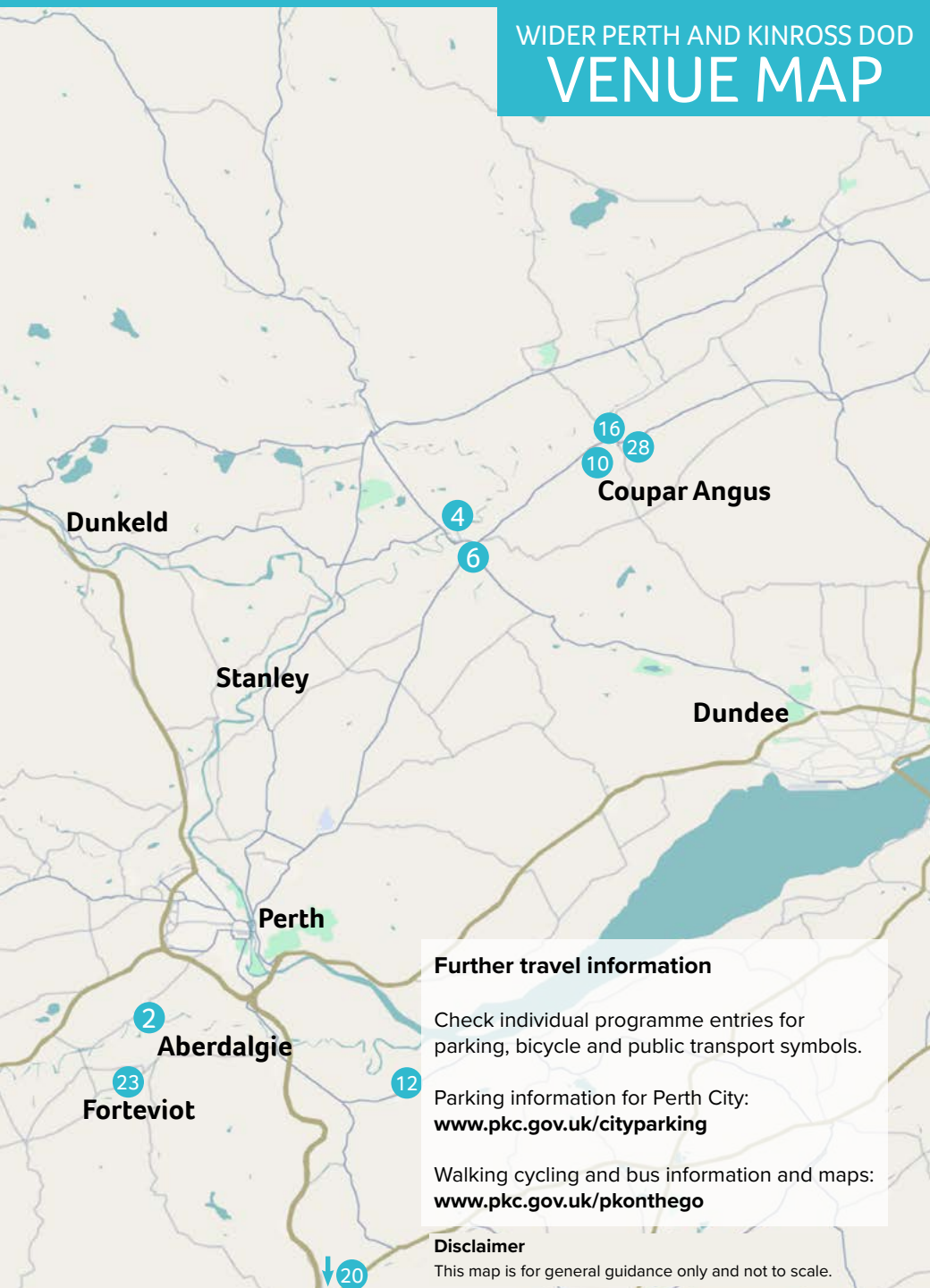


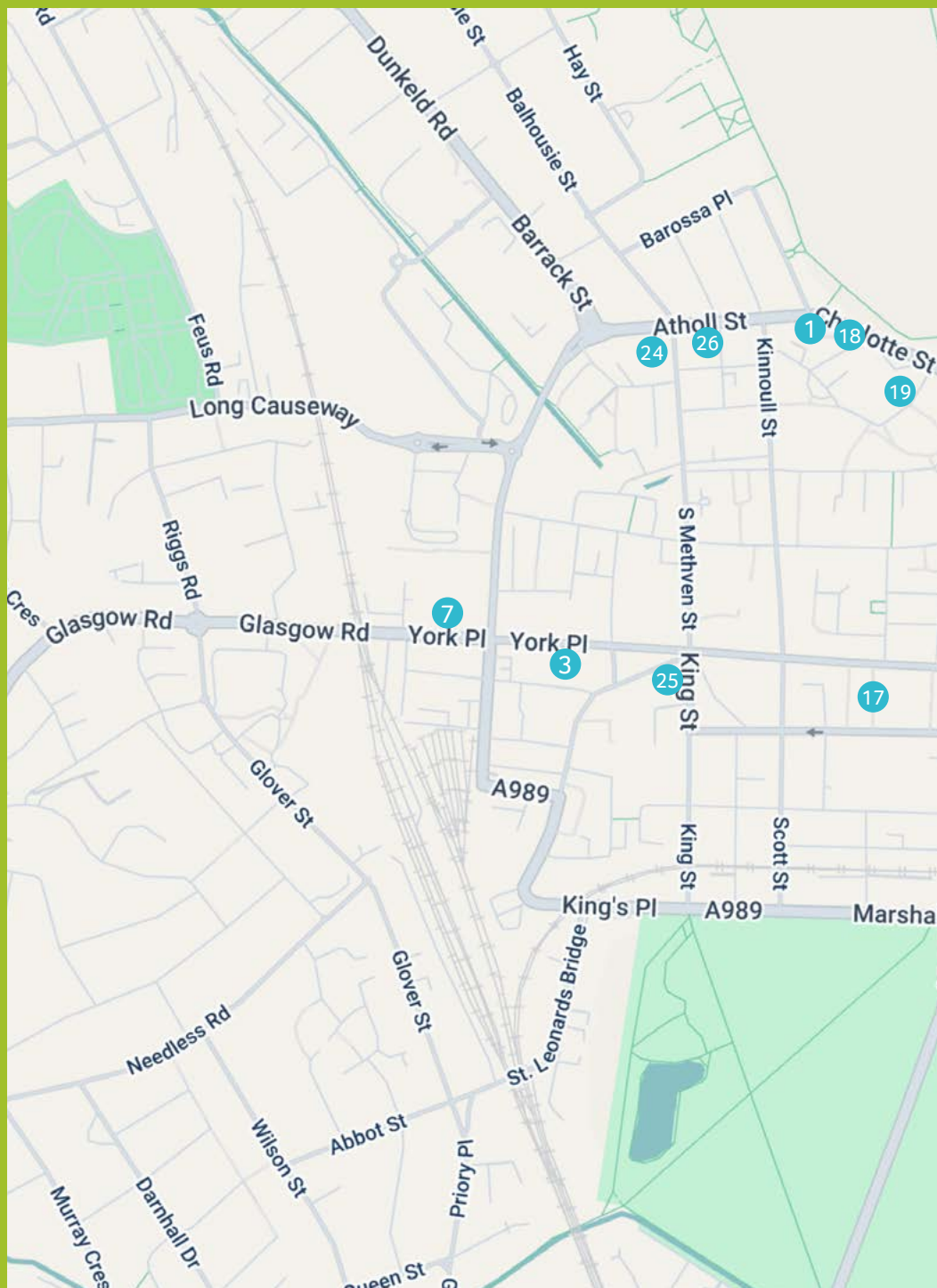

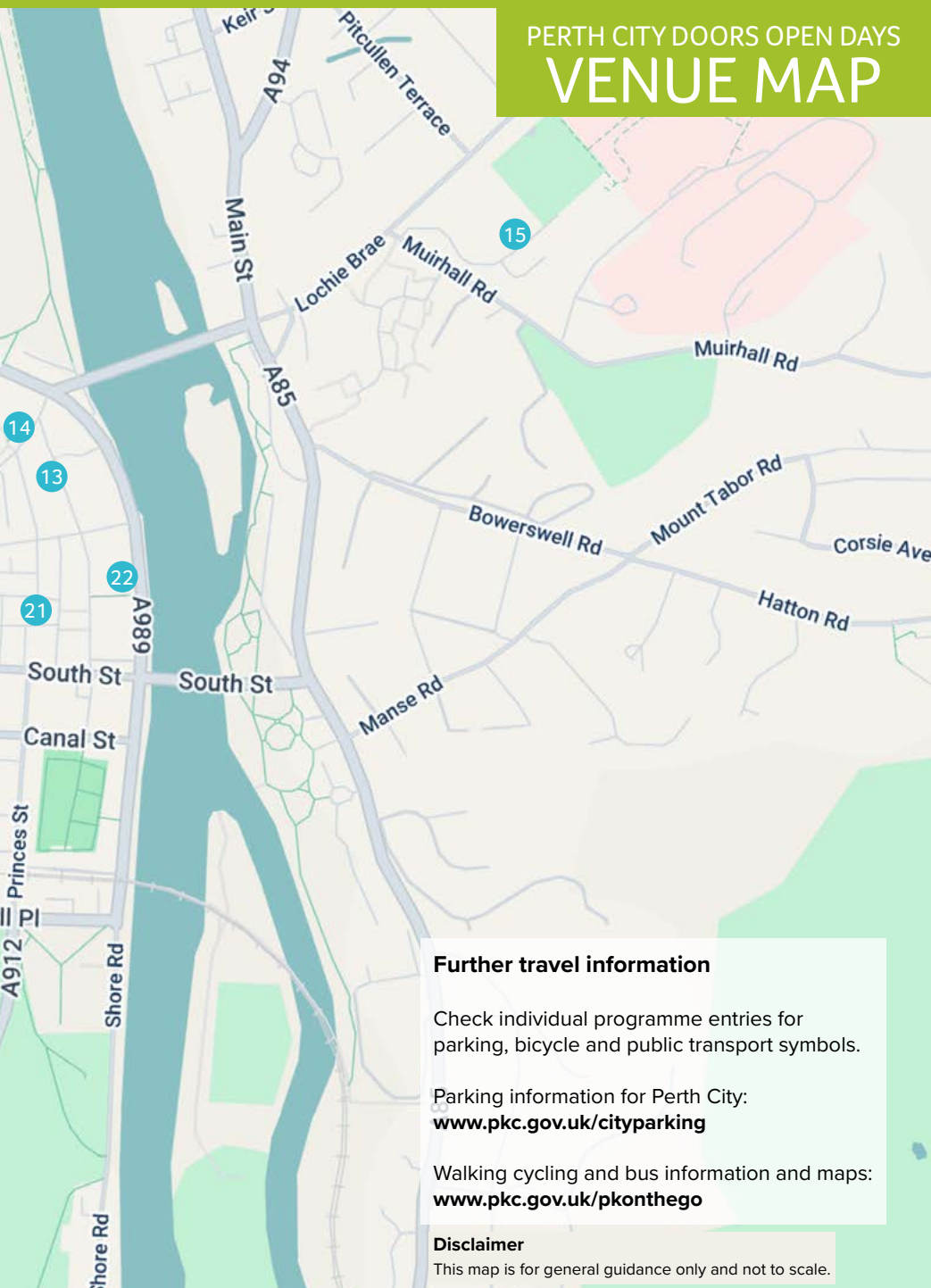


WIDER PERTH AND KINROSS DOD VENUE MAP

#17 Ropemakers Building and Horners Plot



Ropemakers events venue sits on Ropemakers Close, one of 'Perth's Little Streets'. The Blackbird Garden, a peaceful biodiverse space, and Horners Plot, adjacent to the building add to the countryside feel in an urban setting.

Inside Ropemakers Venue we will have photographs of the building before and after transformation.

And the information boards outside the building will illustrate the considerable heritage associated with Ropemakers Close.

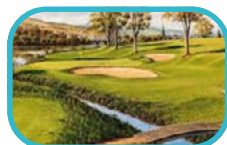
#18 Royal Perth Golfing Society



Instituted as a golfing society within the City of Perth in 1824, Royal Perth is the first and oldest royal golf club in the world. Golf is still central to the ethos of the Club, although other sports and pastimes are now major attractions – clay target shooting, curling, bridge, walking, snooker and fishing. Social activities are equally prominent.

In 1876 the Club acquired its present premises in a Georgian crescent with fine views over the historic North Inch.

The Club is also home to Guildry Incorporation of Perth. The "Guildry" as it is familiarly known, is of great antiquity, and is the direct descendant of the Merchant Guild which received its royal recognition in the famous



Charter which King William the Lion granted to the City of Perth in 1210.

Short tours of the building will be made throughout the day with guides highlighting art, trophies, books and golfing memorabilia as well as some information on the Club history and the Guildry Incorporation. Some archival items will be on display.

#21 St. John's Kirk



A church has stood on this site for 900 years and we are arranging things to mark and celebrate this special year. John Knox preached here in May 1559 arousing much controversy. Robert Lorimer was responsible for restoration in 1926 and further works have recently been completed with more waiting to be done. The Kirk has the largest collection of bells in the country and some beautiful stained glass windows.

#22 St. Matthew's Church



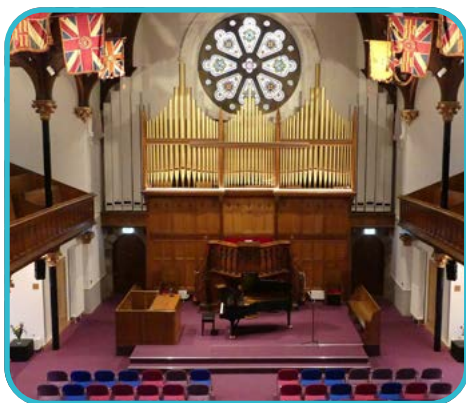
St. Matthew's Church was built in 1871 with its 212ft high steeple. It was internally refurbished 10 years ago maintaining the ambiance of the original building.

A "Walker" pipe organ was installed in 1895 and is still in full use.

On the Saturday morning there will be an ongoing coffee morning with Craft exhibition. Visitors are welcome to join the coffee morning or simply enjoy a visit to the building.

There will be a separate space for quiet meditation and prayer.

#23 St. Andrew's Church Forteviot



Known as The Cradle of Scotland, in the ninth century Kenneth Macalpin, the king who unified the Picts and Scots into a single nation, had his royal palace and chapel at Forteviot.

Enjoy a tour of the church, see the historic bell, the Pictish Stones and the picturesque village built under the instruction of John Dewar, 1st Baron Forteviot, influenced by the Garden City movement.

Heritage display at the village hall with complimentary refreshments.

#24 St. Ninian's Cathedral



A historic 'A listed' Cathedral of the Scottish Episcopal Church begun in 1849 and designed by William Butterfield. Our Lady Chapel, a later addition, was paid for by Mr. MacGregor, later immortalised by Beatrix Potter in her Peter rabbit stories.

#25 The Search for the Perth Charterhouse



Established in 1429 by King James I of Scotland as his royal mausoleum and the Kingdom of Scotland's only monastic house of the Carthusian Order from La Grande Chartreuse in the French Alps. The priory church at the heart of the Perth Charterhouse is said to have been the most beautiful and lavishly decorated in the Kingdom with no expense spared in its construction. Attacked and suppressed 130 years later, the Charterhouse is Perth's lost medieval marvel.

10:00 and 14:00: Walking tours of the Charterhouse precinct led by members of the project team, departing from the Carthusian



Monastery Monument (corner of King and Hospital Streets).

11:00 and 15:00: Dig talks at the Carthusian Monastery Monument with site orientation and discoveries from the archaeological excavations.

#26 The Y Centre



The Y Centre, run by YMCA Tayside, is located in the former St Andrew's and St Stephen's Church buildings in Atholl Street, Perth. The renovation, costing over £6 Million, has been designed with input from the young people who will use it, offers a safe space for people aged eight to 25 and saves two derelict historic buildings from demolition.

Open to all, join us for a behind-the-scenes tour of the Y Centre and a chance to learn about the building's rebirth and our work with the people of Perth.

Split over three floors, the facilities include a digital skills hub, drop-in space, a gaming zone, gym, craft workshop, meeting spaces,



quiet areas, and an outdoor courtyard centred around a restored historic well. Please invite your young people so they can see firsthand what we are all about.

#27 Weem Church



Weem Church was built c1870 as an Episcopal church by Sir Robert Menzies. Due to there being no heir, it transferred to the Church of Scotland in c1918. It contains a pipe organ built by J W Walker c1875 and three stained glass windows depicting pivotal events in the life of Jesus - the Annunciation of Mary, the Ascension of Jesus and the Empty Tomb on Easter day. These were produced by Edward Reginald Frampton of Woolwich, London (who lived from 1845 to 1928).

#28 Coupar Angus Town Hall

A Grade C Listed building within the town's conservation area designed by David Smart and opened in 1887 to celebrate Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee.

Sometimes known as the Victoria Hall it was paid for by public subscription and used for a wide range of community activities.

Covid closed it in 2020. The Coupar Angus Town Hall Association is a registered charity and is working with Perth and Kinross council on a plan to reopen the building.
